MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

True abandonment, he explains, is a trusting, peaceful, and childlike surrender to the guidance of grace.

Introduction to the Devout Life by **St. Francis de Sales**. At once easy to read, being laid out in short chapters, yet thorough, authoritative, reliable, kind and gentle, a mirror of its author, it is a book, moreover, for all, because all are called to the devout life. True devotion to God, the author points out, adorns every vocation. The devout life, moreover, is a lovely, a pleasant, and a happy life.

The Spiritual Combat and a Treatise on Peace of Soul provides timeless guidance in spiritual discipline. St. Francis de Sales (1576-1622) read from it himself every day and recommended it to everyone under his direction. Vigorous, realistic and full of keen insight into human nature, *The Spiritual Combat* consists of short chapters based on the maxim that in the spiritual life one must either "fight or die". **Fr. Scupoli** shows the Christian how to combat his passions and vices, especially impurity and sloth, in order to arrive at victory.

BLESSED ANTHONY GRASSI OF THE ORATORY

He was born in 1592, and at sixteen joined St. Philip's Oratory at Fermo, Italy. He was a brilliant student with a severe case of scruples that lasted until he celebrated his first Mass, but from then on he was characterized by imperturbable serenity.

He used to say that, in forming an estimate of a man, one should not look at an individual trait, but take all of that person's qualities together and then more good than bad will generally be found. So he was a very gentle superior; and when asked why he did not show more severity, he said that he did not know how. When questioned as to whether he wore a hair shirt, he replied that he had learned from St. Philip that it was better to begin with spiritual mortifications, like humbling the mind and will. **Friday December 15 is the Feast of Bl. Anthony Grassi.**

A sung English Mass will be celebraated in his honour.
