If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

Great for apologetics, *The Great Divorce* is a good self-examination of our common faults and attitudes, even if it is based on Lewis's lightly erroneous idea of Purgatory. *The Screwtape Letters* is a good way of understanding the all-too-effective wiles of Satan.
