MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

The Oratory Summer School

Since 1989, the Oratory has offered a summer school for lay people. There are two week-long sessions, with three classes each day, taught by one of the Fathers or Brothers of the Oratory. A special Mass is celebrated. And lunch is served. The day begins at 8:30 a.m. and ends at 3:00 p.m. The Oratory can accommodate a limited number of people in the seminary residence. The fee for the course is \$175 per session, which includes lunch. The surcharge for rooms in the seminary residence is \$75 per week. Masses ad orientem

All the Masses at Holy Family and St Vincent de Paul Church are now said *ad orientem*. This means that for the liturgy of the Eucharist, the priest will face the Tabernacle (the liturgical "orient" or east). We are inspired to make this return to the tradition by the recent visit of Cardinal Robert Sarah to Toronto, during which he urged priests to be "prudentially audacious" in saying Masses ad orientem. Cardinal Sarah is the prefect of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments. He has urged this in other contexts as well, arguing that this is the traditional liturgical posture. It involves the priest and the congregation both turning towards God to offer a pure sacrifice to Him. This orientation highlights the fact that the Mass is a sacrifice and it has always been permitted by the post-Vatican II liturgical documents.

The Latin-English Missal - **\$10.00.**

Heretic by Matti Leisola. According to the science and educational establishments, Darwin's theory of evolution is a clearly established fact. It fully explains the origin of all living species including man. But does it really do that? *Heretic* is written by a scientist, Matti Leisola, who very early in his career came to the conclusion that Darwinism is all hype and no substance. The book documents the persecution of dissenters such as him on this issue, while at the same time providing many interesting arguments to buttress his position. – *Fr Martin Hilbert*

A Song for Nagasaki: The Story of Takashi Nagai, Scientist, Convert, and Survivor of the Atomic Bomb This masterful book's 31 chapters are little gems of beauty and faith. You can read each chapter in less than 15 minutes. My favourite is chapter 10! A Song of Nagasaki is a love story that brings out the remarkable truth that the Church is mystical body of Christ. Reading this biography will likely bring tears to your eyes on three or four occasions. Great spiritual reading for Eastertide! – Fr. Michael Eades

CHRONICLES OF NARNIA - I never knew about this wonderful books in my childhood. I read them after I met Fr. Robinson. They are great for children, and great for us older folk. Packaged sets and individual books are available. ALERT!!! There are opinions about the order of reading. My advice is to start with *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe*.

Other great books by C. S. Lewis are also available. I recommend *Mere Christianity* for a wonderful, easy to understand, common sense explanation of why Christianity works. Great for apologetics, *The Great Divorce* is a good self-examination of our common faults and attitudes, even if it is based on Lewis's slightly erroneous idea of Purgatory. *The Screwtape Letters* is a good way of understanding the all-too-effective wiles of Satan.
