MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

His Holiness, St. John Paul II in His Encyclical Letter "*The Gospel of Life*" said: "...procured abortion is the deliberate and direct killing, by whatever means it is carried out, of a human being in the initial phase of his or her existence, extending from conception to birth."

Many forget that the status quo in Canada is any abortion, at any time, for any reason, at taxpayers' expense. Many don't know that over a third (37.4%) of abortions are done on women who have already had one or more abortions. Many don't realize that as a Catholic Christian we need to defend life and publicly oppose abortion. Mother Teresa said: "*Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love but to use violence to get what they want. This is why the greatest destroyer of love and peace is abortion.*"

Life Chain is a simple and prayerful way to give public witness to the Truth that abortion is a violent destruction of human life. It takes only an hour and all you have to do is stand quietly with others, holding a sign with a simple message. The signs say: "Abortion kills Children", "Abortion hurts Women", and "Jesus forgives and heals". And as you stand, you can quietly pray the Rosary for the conversion of our leaders.

PARDON? AND PEACE!!!

"The rule of confession once a year was made at the Fourth Lateran Council, in the early thirteenth century... That was the time of England's King John, who, it was recorded, used to take a bath once a year whether he need it or not. Now is that really good enough by modern standards? ... There is more pollution than there was in the twelfth century, and those who live in a secular modern society must need more regular cleansing than those who lived in the age of faith.... That is why I find it sad when people turn up regularly every Christmas Eve to make their annual confession. "It is one year since my last confession. I think I used a bad word once. For that and all other sins which I cannot now remember I ask pardon of God ..."

I strongly recommend this book on the Sacrament of Penance/Reconciliation/Confession. It has been a great help to me, and is a very readable guide to the benefits of regular confession for all of us sinners. One caveat/caution: on p.50 and p. 55, Father Randolph comes a little too close to the theory of the *fundamental option*. It isn't a problem, but it you have questions, feel free to speak to any of the priests about what he is saying, and what he is NOT saying.

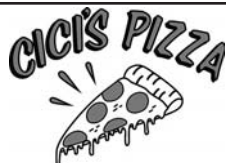
