It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

BLESSED ANTHONY GRASSI OF THE ORATORY

He was born in 1592, and at sixteen joined St. Philip's Oratory at Fermo, Italy. He was a brilliant student with a severe case of scruples that lasted until he celebrated his first Mass. From then on he was characterized by imperturbable serenity.

He used to say that, in forming an estimate of a man, one should not look at an individual trait, but take all of that person's qualities together, and then more good than bad will generally be found. So he was a very gentle superior; and when asked why he did not show more severity, he said that he did not know how. When questioned as to whether he wore a hair shirt, he replied that he had learned from St. Philip that it was better to begin with spiritual mortifications, like humbling the mind and will.

His feast day will be celebrated next Saturday, December 15 with a sung English Mass at 10:00 a.m. Please join us in honouring this Oratorian Blessed.
