MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

FEAST OF BLESSED SEBASTIAN VALFRÉ OF THE ORATORY

Blessed Sebastian was born at Verduno in Piedmont in 1629. From his childhood he determined to become a priest, and was accepted by the Fathers of the Oratory at Turin, joining the congregation on St. Philip's Day in 1651. He received the priesthood a year later, and gave himself up unreservedly to his priestly duties. In 1661 he was elected superior in spite of his own earnest remonstrances. His governance was a perfect copy of that of St. Philip, enforcing exact observance in every detail, but showing great tenderness to the sick, for whom nothing was thought too good. His life was the model of that of a zealous pastor in a city where misery and evil abound, and it is in no way surprising that he was regarded by all as a saint. He is described as dying of punctuality; for hurrying to evening prayer, he arrived overheated, prayed in a cool room, and caught a chill. The Apostle of Turin died on January 30, 1710 at the age of eighty. He was beatified by Pope Gregory XVI in 1834.
