A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

WITH THE END IN MIND: Dying, Death and Wisdom in an Age of Denial. Wow! Emotional, uplifting. Wise and practical! An inspiring account of one doctor's experience in helping people face death. Note: not helping people by killing them, but by helping them when they or their loved ones are approaching the end of their lives.. In the doctor's own words: "It's a tiny glimpse into a phenomenon that is happening somewhere around us every single day. By encountering death any thousand s of times, I have come to a view that there is usually little to fear and much to prepare for. Sadly, I regularly meet patients and families who believe the opposite: that death is dreadful, and talking about it or preparing for it will be unbearably sad or frightening." This book will do much to dispel the fear of talking about death and preparing for it, and is recommended for everyone.
