MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

IF THIS IS PALLIATIVE CARE, BRING IT ON!

WITH THE END IN MIND: *Dying, Death and Wisdom in an Age of Denial*. Wow! Emotional, uplifting. Wise and practical! An inspiring account of one doctor's experience in helping people face death. Note: not helping people by **killing** them, but by **helping** them when they or their loved ones are approaching the end of their lives.. In the doctor's own words: "*It's a tiny glimpse into a phenomenon that is happening somewhere around us every single day. By encountering death any thousand s of times, I have come to a view that there is usually little to fear and much to prepare for. Sadly, I regularly meet patients and families who believe the opposite: that death is dreadful, and talking about it or preparing for it will be unbearably sad or frightening.*" This book will do much to dispel the fear of talking about death and preparing for it, and is recommended for everyone.

THE SACRAMENTS: *Discovering the Treasures of Divine Life*, by Fr. Matthew Kauth. Solid Catholic theology with spiritual teaching. Accessible to laymen (yes, laywomen too), profitable for seminarians and priests. Instead of WWJD (What would Jesus do?), Fr. Kauth shows WJIDN (What Jesus is doing now). That is, how the sacraments, sacred signs, actually accomplish in our souls what they signify. Highly recommended. **Special introductory price, \$8 till Feb. 28.**

Anyone wishing to make monthly contributions to the parish by direct debit can now do so. Brochures, which serve as the registration forms, are available in the narthex and in the rectory. Parishioners who choose to take advantage of this way of contributing are still asked to retain their envelopes because (1) there are collections other than the regular Sunday ones and it is easier to identify your contribution if you have a Sunday envelope number, (2) dropping an empty envelope with PAG written on it helps to educate the young that it is important to support the church and lets us know that you are attending Mass. This latter point is especially important if you ever need a letter from the pastor stating that you regularly practice your faith.
