# **MARRIAGES:**

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

Wednesday (April 17) at 8:00 p.m. Tenebræ Confessions: 7:30 to 7:55 p.m. Holy Thursday (April 18) (No Masses during the day. Church open at 9:00 a.m.) Mass of the Lord's Supper: 8:00 p.m. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until midnight. Confessions: 7:00 - 7:45 p.m., and after the Mass of the Lord's Supper until midnight. Pabasa begins in the parish hall after the Mass and continues until Noon on Good Friday. **Good Friday (April 19)** (This is a day of fast and abstinence.)
