MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

From Islam to Christ. Derya Little (not her real name) was born in Turkey. Her nominally Muslim parents divorced when she was a teenager, and, as a clever but bitter and cynical child, she embraced atheism. In an effort to convert an Evangelical Christian to atheism, she came to recognize atheism as a false religion and became a Protestant. But her ever curious mind could not be content with the inherent problems of *sola scriptura*. So she read her way into the Catholic Church and had to overcome great difficulties even to find a Catholic Church in Ankara. Her first-hand knowledge of Islam and her persuasive criticism of it are the reason why she uses a pseudonym. An inspiring story that should help us to appreciate the gift of faith in Christ and his Church. \$26

JESUS and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist: Unlocking the Secrets of the Last Supper. Thank God Grant Pitre proposed to the daughter of a Protestant minister, or this book would not have been written. The scathing arguments the pastor produced forced Grant to explore his Catholic Faith, and was able to discover how biblical, and how fulfilling of the Old Testament, the Eucharist is. This book will deepen your faith in the Sacrifice of the Mass and the Real Presence, and enable you to engage in truly evangelical discourse with non-Catholics. \$25

JESUS and the JEWISH ROOTS OF MARY, by Brant Pitre. This is an awesome book that will strengthen your faith in the Catholic teachings on Mary, deepen your knowledge of the Old and New Testament, and provide great answers to questions about Mary. \$30

THE SACRAMENTS: Discovering the Treasures of Divine Life, by Fr. Matthew Kauth. Solid Catholic theology with spiritual teaching. Accessible to all. Instead of WWJD (What would Jesus do?), Fr. Kauth shows WJIDN (What Jesus is doing now). That is, how the sacraments, sacred signs, actually accomplish in our souls what they signify. Highly recommended. \$8

The Thirtieth Annual Oratory Theology Summer School

In addition to this being our thirtieth year of Summer School, this year will also see the canonization of John Henry Newman, Oratorian. Each year there are two week-long sessions, with three classes each day, taught by one of the Fathers or Brothers of the Oratory. A special Mass is celebrated. And lunch is served. The day begins at 8:30 a.m. and ends at 3:00 p.m. The Oratory can accommodate a limited number of people in the seminary residence. **The fee for each session is \$175 per person, and this includes lunch. The surcharge for rooms in the seminary residence is \$75 per week.** Please note that the courses are aimed at adults and older teens.

Dates for Session 1: July 1-5, 2019 – The first week is an introduction to the Catechism of the Catholic Church. This session is a prerequisite for enrolment in the second session, taken either in the current year or in previous years.

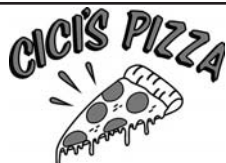
