#### **MARRIAGES:**

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

A Canadian Premiere on Pentecost Sunday On Sunday, June 9th (Pentecost Sunday), the Mass setting at the 11:00 am Solemn High Mass will be the Missa *Chicagoensis* by Stephanie Martin, a Toronto-based composer and professor at York University. This Mass setting was commissioned by the Canons Regular of St John Cantius and was first sung in 2017 at their church in Chicago; it will be receiving its Canadian premiere here at Holy Family.

#### The Thirtieth Annual **Oratory Theology Summer School**

In addition to this being our thirtieth year of Summer School, this year will also see the canonization of John Henry Newman, Oratorian. Each year there are two week-long sessions, with three classes each day, taught by one of the Fathers or Brothers of the Oratory. A special Mass is celebrated. And lunch is served. The day begins at 8:30 a.m. and ends at 3:00 p.m. The Oratory can accommodate a limited number of people in the seminary residence. The fee for each session is \$175 per person, and this includes lunch. The surcharge for rooms in the seminary residence is \$75 per week. Please note that the courses are aimed at adults and older teens.

Dates for Session 1: July 1-5, 2019 – The first week is an introduction to the Catechism of the Catholic Church. This session is a prerequisite for enrolment in the second session, taken either in the current year or in previous years.

Dates for Session 2: July 8-12, 2019 – The topic for the Second Session will be: John Henry Newman.
