MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

A Rediscovered Motet for Corpus Christi

On Sunday, June 23rd (Corpus Christi), the Solemn Vespers liturgy will include the motet *Salve Jhesu Summe Bone* by **Pierre de la Rue**, resident composer to the Habsburg court chapel in the Burgundian Netherlands from 1492 to 1516. *Salve Jhesu* was believed to have been lost in the late sixteenth century, but the piece was rediscovered in 2018 by the musicologist Eric Jas of the University of Utrecht; at our Vespers liturgy it will be sung for what is likely the first time in the modern era. The motet was composed in honour of the Precious Blood of Christ, with a text by the thirteenth-century Cistercian abbot Arnulf of Leuven.

The Thirtieth Annual Oratory Theology Summer School

In addition to this being our thirtieth year of Summer School, this year will also see the canonization of John Henry Newman, Oratorian. Each year there are two week-long sessions, with three classes each day, taught by one of the Fathers or Brothers of the Oratory. A special Mass is celebrated. And lunch is served. The day begins at 8:30 a.m. and ends at 3:00 p.m. The Oratory can accommodate a limited number of people in the seminary residence. **The fee for each session is \$175 per person, and this includes lunch. The surcharge for rooms in the seminary residence is \$75 per week.** Please note that the courses are aimed at adults and older teens.

Dates for Session 1: July 1-5, 2019 – The first week is an introduction to the Catechism of the Catholic Church. This session is a prerequisite for enrolment in the second session, taken either in the current year or in previous years.

Dates for Session 2: July 8-12, 2019 – The topic for the Second Session will be: *John Henry Newman*. In 2010 we had a special session of our summer school to mark his beatification, and now we turn our attention back to this most famous of English converts in thanksgiving for his canonization - a great blessing for the Oratory, the Church of England, and the Church throughout the world.
