MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS CATHOLIC HISTORY WALK 'Within a Stone's Throw, Part Two' - Saturday, October 26 at 1:00 pm in front of St. Michael's Cathedral.

This time we'll be dealing with some of the clashes between the Catholics and the Protestants that became a regular feature of life in Toronto in the second half of the 19th century. You'll hear about the time Orangemen stopped a Catholic parade at the point of a cannon; the time several thousand Protestants surrounded the Cathedral to make sure that no Catholic stepped out of the Cathedral precincts; and also about the time 8,000 Protestants attacked a procession of 2,000 Catholics. And, above all, you'll learn why these walks and talks about Catholic history in Toronto are called '*Within a Stone's Throw*'. We'll end at St. Mary's at the intersection of Bathurst and Adelaide probably around 3:30 – 4 pm. Please bring comfortable shoes.

BOILER UPDATE The new boilers have now been installed and are up and running. They are higher efficiency units than the previous one, so we look forward to saving money on gas. For the mechanically inclined, the boiler room is now a work of art. The project itself

came in on budget: \$54,000 plus HST. As a charity, we get a substantial refund back on the HST paid -- 70 % -- so in the end the cost was \$56,106. I am happy to report that the extra collection we had for this purpose brought in \$22,590. Our Family of Faith account provided a further \$23,105. The remaining \$10,411, we covered out of our operating account. So whether you gave to the boiler fund or to Family of Faith or to the regular Sunday collection,
