Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

AWAKE, NOT WOKE! "Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give you light." – Ephesians 5:14. The long-simmering crisis that grips our culture has exploded in recent years, leaving us divided and intransigent. Discourse seems futile when we are no longer a people with shared principles or even a shared understanding of reality. What seems obvious to one person is patently absurd to the next. 

OBERAMMERGAU AND SAINTS OF 1622 PILGRIMAGE Approaching from the West - Sept. 11-24, 2022

UNDER THE DIRECTION OF FR. MICHAEL EADES - \$5,590 Every ten years the famous Passion play is performed in Germany. On the way to Germany, we will visit four other countries: Spain, France, Italy, and Switzerland. 1622 is the 400th anniversary of the death of **St Francis de Sales**. We will visit his shrine and the shrine of St Janes Frances de Chantal in Annecy, France. 1622 is also the 400th anniversary of the Canonization of St Teresa of Avila, St Isidore the Farmer, St Ignatius, St Francis Xavier, and St Philip Neri. We will visit stunning Toledo where St Teresa lived and wrote some of her most important works. We will visit Madrid where the body of St Isidore is, the patron of Madrid. We will drive through parts of Spain where St Ignatius and St Francis Xavier grew up on our way to the apparition site of Mary at Lourdes. Many cultural and historical stops included, including the Turin, Milan, and Avignon where Popes lived for 70 and where St Catherine of Sienna visited to persuade the Pope to return to Rome. In Turin, we will visit the church of the Shroud of Turin and the tombs of St John Bosco and Bl Sebastian Valfre, the St Philip Neri of Turin. Visiting monasteries and the beautiful Swiss Alps will prepare us for the culmination of the trip, one day in **Oberammergau**, for the play depicting Christ's Passion.
