MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

WEEK 2 (JULY 11-15) BOOKS (AND PEOPLE) THAT BEGIN WITH S

This year we celebrate the 400th anniversary of the canonization of the "Five Saints" —Saints Philip Neri, Ignatius of Loyola, Francis Xavier, Teresa of Avila, and Isodore the Farmer. It was an important celebration of the spiritual fruitfulness of the Catholic Counter-Reformation.

The anniversary gives us the opportunity to reflect on the idea of sanctity and the powerful example that the saints give us, the Church's beginning to recognize various Christians as saints in the liturgy, and the canonical process of canonization the Church developed. Saint Philip was convinced that Catholics should give more attention to lives of the saints—reading books that begin with the letter "S", like Saint Augustine, Saint Benedict, etc.

The course will be available this year again both in person and online. Those enrolled in the course can attend live through Zoom, and recordings will be made available for one week after the completion of the course to allow those whose schedules won't allow them to attend live to watch the classes.

For those attending only online, the cost for each session will be **\$150.** For those attending in person, the cost for each session will be **\$175 per person, which includes lunch for the five days.**

For those who would like to avoid travelling each day, simple accommodation is available in the Oratory's new Seminary Residence. The rooms are single, with shared bathrooms, and have access to simple cooking facilities and the Seminary Chapel. **The cost for a room is \$75 per person, per week**, and participants are responsible for bringing their own bedding for a single bed. (Still one of the great bargains of the Western World.)
