MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

SPECIAL COLLECTION

FOR INDIGENOUS HEALING & RECONCILIATION This year's National Day for Truth and Reconciliation took place last Friday, September 30. Cardinal Collins presided at a Mass with participation from Indigenous members of the community.

The Archdiocese of Toronto will also hold a special collection to support the Indigenous Healing and Reconciliation Fund. Envelopes are being distributed this weekend, and the collection will be taken up next Sunday, October 9. The fund will support both local and national programs proposed by Indigenous communities to nurture the ongoing reconciliation journey.

Funds will support culture and language revitalization, education and community building, healing and reconciliation for communities and families, as well as dialogue involving Indigenous elders, spiritual leaders and youth, with a focus on Indigenous spirituality and culture.

The Indigenous Healing & Reconciliation fund is part of a national effort announced by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops. The Bishops of Canada have made a \$30-million collective financial commitment to support healing and reconciliation initiatives among Indigenous Peoples.
