MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

This year October 9 is also Thanksgiving Day, so Masses will follow a holiday schedule, at 10:00 a.m., 11:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. **We will celebrate St. John Henry Newman with a sung English Mass at 5:00 pm.**

Also on Monday, **Br. Jeffrey Sullivan** will have been aggregated into the Community, meaning that he will have ceased to be a novice and will now be a triennial member of the **Oratory**. **At the 5 p.m. Mass, he will receive the Candidacy for the priesthood. And at the same Mass, Br. Bruno Hegedus will receive the ministry of Lector.**

Saint John Henry Newman

John Henry Cardinal Newman (1801-1890) is the best-known Oratorian in the English speaking world. Shortly after his conversion from Anglicanism to Catholicism in 1845, he brought the developed form of Oratorian life to England. At that time there were no Oratories in the English speaking world, and many Italian Oratories were disappearing during the Risorgimento. Father Newman founded the Birmingham Oratory, and then sent Father Faber to London to found an Oratory there.

Pope Leo XIII elevated Newman to the rank of cardinal in 1879. He continued to live his Oratorian life in Birmingham until his death in 1890, when he died of pneumonia. John Henry Newman was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI on 19 September 2010 in Birmingham, England, and canonized by Pope Francis on 13 October 2019.
