MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Apology: Last Friday was the first Friday of the month. We always have a Holy Hour from 8pm-9pm on First Fridays. But I forgot to put the Holy Hour in the bulletin!

Why do we have Holy Hours? When Our Lord was praying in the Garden of Gethsemane on the night of His arrest, he returned to find His three closest friends sleeping. "Can you not watch one hour with me?" (Matthew 26:40).

Why are First Fridays chosen for Holy Hours? Arrested late on Holy Thursday night, Our Lord was tried and condemned to death on Good Friday. After three hours on the Cross, He breathed His last. Friday nights recall Christ's being taken down from the Cross and laid in the tomb of Joseph of Arimathea. By spending an hour with Christ hidden under the appearances of bread, we make up for all those who refuse to love and to honour Christ who died for us.

When did this devotion begin? In the late 1600s, Christ began showing Himself to a French nun of the Visitation Order, St Margaret Mary Alcoque. In these visions, Christ appeared alive, but with His heart displayed in front of His chest. His heart was on fire with a crown of thorns around it. Christ wanted people to remember that His love is primary. We do not have to earn His love. We do not have to make Him love us. Christ asked St Margaret Mary to tell others about the graces He offers on the First Friday of the month. We begin each month by making amends for the indifference of so many to Him and His love.

How did Christ show His love in Last Sunday's readings? In the new Mass, Christ fed 5,000 men, not including the women and children. He fed them with *five* loaves of bread and *two* fish, food given to Him by his Apostles. When Christ made the crowds sit in the grass, he took the bread, blessed, broke it and gave it to his disciples. They then gave it to the crowds.

Why did Christ use five loaves and two fish? $5+2=7$. Over the previous two weeks, we heard seven parables spoken on the same day (Mt 13). These seven symbolize the seven sacraments. But the sacraments are divided into two groups.

"Never be afraid of loving the Blessed Virgin Mary too much; you can never love her more than Jesus did."

— St. Maximilian Kolbe, who died on 14 August 1941, the vigil of the Assumption. He died in a starvation bunker, having voluntarily taken the place of another prisoner in the Nazi concentration camp.
