MARRIAGES:

Couples planning to be married must contact a priest well in advance of the wedding date. They must also receive personal preparation for entering marriage.

If either party has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted.

It should be noted that Catholics, in order to marry validly, must marry before the parish priest or his delegate and two witnesses. A civil marriage or a marriage before a non-Catholic minister is not a valid marriage. Couples in such "marriages" should contact a priest to have the situation rectified.

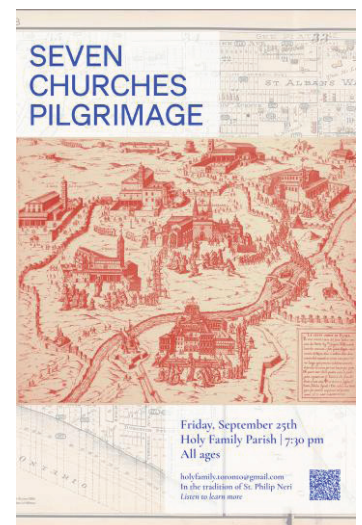

Pastor's Corner

Father, how far back in Canada does devotion to the Sacred Heart go?

Pretty much to the beginning of Christianity in our land. The first Jesuit missionaries arrived around 1625. But the real establishment of the Church in this land dates to 1 August 1639. This was the day the first nuns arrived. The Jesuits had realized that the Church would not last without the help of female missionaries. God had placed it in the heart of the widow and mother, the nun, St Marie of the Incarnation, to travel to Canada. For years, God had allowed her in her prayers to travel to parts of the world where Christ was not known. Gradually these "bi-locations" centred on Canada. In her autobiography she writes:

"I no longer saw any country except Canada, and my greatest journeyings were in the land of the Hurons, accompanying those who were spreading the Gospel, united in spirit to the Eternal Father under the **patronage of the Sacred Heart of Jesus**, in order to win souls for him there."

Jesus told her that she was to build a house for Jesus and Mary in this country. This is what she tried to do. Despite many setbacks and sacrifices, she never abandoned her mission in this land. Everything was carried out under the patronage of the Sacred Heart, the symbol of His unconquerable love. Let us continue her work. Let us do everything in the name of Christ's love placing our parish family under the sign of His love.

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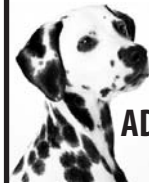
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
